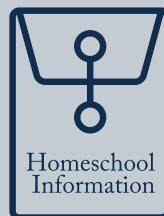
Due to COVID-19, this in-person event is not possible. In its place, FPM and CHEA of California are hosting a virtual event to prepare you to meet with your legislators.

All Virtual Capitol Day and Advocacy from Home participants must undergo an application process for approval prior to meeting with their legislator. Once approved, a homeschool informational packet will be sent to you so you can provide it your legislator.

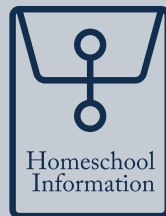


# Advocacy from Home



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**What is Advocacy from Home?** Through Virtual Capitol Day, we will equip and train you on how to meet your state legislators through their local district offices.
